GOVERNMENT'S RESPONSE TO DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO VACATE CONVICTIONS BASED ON ACTUAL INNOCENCE

The United States, by and through its attorney, the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia, respectfully provides this Response on Defendant's Motion to Vacate Convictions Based on Actual Innocence.

- 1. The government can now advise the Court that today, December 14, 2009, we received a final report from Dr. Angela Williamson, Ph.D., Director of Forensic Casework at Bode-Technology, advising that Mr. Gates has been excluded as a possible contributor to the male DNA profile obtained from the vaginal slide (Medical Examiner Vagina A 81-06-489), previously submitted for testing. This report is now attached to this Response as Exhibit 1.
- 2. The government has also reviewed the defense arguments on the questions surrounding microscopic hair analysis, as outlined in the defendant's Motion to Vacate, and the allegations set forth against the hair examiner who testified at trial in this case, Michael P. Malone, in the Special Report issued by the Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General. The government has also reviewed the specific evaluations of Malone's work in

this case, as outlined in the FBI's Independent Case Review conducted by Steve Robertson, and later provided through the General Counsel of the FBI to Amy Jabloner in the Department of Justice Criminal Division. Although copies of the documents attached to the Motion to Vacate indicate that this report was sent directly to the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia, it appears that this material was never received in the Special Proceedings Division.

It is of significant concern to our office that the Division apparently never received the results of the independent FBI investigation concerning the work of hair examiner Michael P. Malone in this case, which, as part of our general practice, we would have disclosed upon receipt. Accordingly, we are now investigating the matter in order to determine whether the FBI letter was, in fact, received by our office, and if so, whether it was subsequently transmitted to the Special Proceedings Division.

3. At this point, the government submits that the defendant should be immediately released from incarceration pending further testing. The United States requests a brief additional period of time in order to locate the family of Catherine Schilling to advise them of the results of the DNA testing; to obtain a buccal swab from one of the parents of Catherine Schilling and send that to Bode-Technology, in order to confirm that the female DNA profile obtained from testing the vaginal slide represents, in fact, the DNA profile of the decedent in this case; and also to obtain a second buccal swab from defendant Donald Gates, for further comparison against the DNA profile of Donald Gates previously obtained

for testing based on the Court's Order of November 4, 2009.

4. A defendant is entitled to release pending the determination of a collateral attack motion if he establishes "exceptional circumstances" warranting such release. See Baker v. Sard, 420 F.2d 1342, 1343 (D.C. Cir. 1969). The government believes defendant has made such a showing in this case, and therefore does not object to defendant's release pending the final disposition of his motion. A proposed Order is attached.

STR CASE PROCESSING, RESULTS, AND CONCLUSIONS:

Sample CCA0968-0130-E02 was processed for DNA typing by analysis of the following loci: D13S317, D7S820, D2S1338, D21S11, D16S539, D18S51, CSF1PO, FGA, and the gender determining locus Amelogenin using the AmpFLSTR® MiniFiler kit.

Sample CCA0968-0130-R04 was processed for DNA typing by analysis of the 13 CODIS Short Tandem Repeat loci, the D2S1338 locus, the D19S433 locus, and the gender determining locus Amelogenin using the AmpFLSTR® Identifiler® kit.

Appropriate positive and negative controls were used concurrently throughout the analysis. The DNA profiles reported in this case were determined by procedures that have been validated according to standards established by the Scientific Working Group on DNA Analysis Methods (SWGDAM) and adopted as Federal Standards.

STR CASE PROCESSING, RESULTS, AND CONCLUSIONS (cont.):

- 1. A DNA profile was obtained from sample CCA0968-0130-R04 (Donald E. Gates).
- 2. The DNA profile obtained from the sperm fraction (SF) of sample CCA0968-0130-E02 is consistent with a male profile. One additional allele was reported at the D13S317 locus.

The individual associated with sample CCA0968-0130-R04 (Donald E. Gates) is excluded as a possible contributor to the DNA profile obtained from the sample noted above.

3. The DNA profile obtained from the epithelial fraction (EF) of sample CCA0968-0130-E02 is consistent with a mixture of two individuals including a major component female profile.

The individual associated with CCA0968-0130-R04 (Donald E. Gates) is excluded as a possible contributor to the DNA profile obtained from the sample noted above.

See Table 1 for summary of allele reported for each sample.
